

"Going Green" with Project Romania started 'small' in December 2008. In the first 18 months we managed to collect ONE TONNE!

Since then the idea has taken root in this area and in many other places where friends or family of current collectors live, and it's no surprise to get a phone call from someone up country who has "heard of us".

Now, in January 2013 we have recycled over SEVEN tonne!! What happens to the tops ?

They go to GHS Recycling in Portsmouth and are ground into powder before being taken to a factory where they are melted and recycled into plastic garden furniture, children's slides and toys, fleeces, bollards etc. They really are **RE** used, and do NOT go into landfill.

There are **5** million tops in **1** tonne and because they are light in weight the gross size in

area of 7 tonne is enormous, and if one considers how much landfill this would take up, and how long these tops take to bio-degrade - it's a very worthwhile task.

> We collect - ANY & ALL tops made of polyethylene.

They will all have a small Mobius triangle with '2', '4', '02' '04' inside, and HDPE or LDPE below that
